

## New Forrester Products For Fall 2009

There are 3 new products for this fall:

- 1. Shawl Broaches:** These broaches can be used for shawls, sweaters or scarves. They are in a variety of exotic woods and of various designs. The base broach is feathered at the edges while the area around the hole is about ¼” thick. This design gives strength to the broaches while giving a light air to the look. The broach holes are between 1” and 1.25”, thus good for pulling through a bit of knitted or woven material to lock into place with the matching broach pins. The broaches are reversible with turning pattern on one side and plain on the other for a more formal look. The broaches retail at \$23.95 for the fancy ones (top 4: sheep, alpaca, pewter, fancy pin) and \$19.95 for the simpler ones (bottom 8).

Additionally, there is a selection of **straight pins for shawls**. These are also in a variety of exotic woods, are about 5” to 6” long, and about ¼” in diameter. They all have fancy turned heads. Retail is at \$13.95 each.

- 2. Spindle Stands:** These stands hold a single Forrester spindle in display mode. They were design to hold a Forrester spindle at a slight upward angle to facilitate showing off the fancy whorls. These are also in a variety of native & exotic woods, and have 5 little rubber pad-feet on the base to hold the stand securely in place while displaying the spindle on a desk, mantle, etc.

There are 2 basic types, **Pyrography** (to match the *Orchard* and *Country Roads* Forrester spindle designs; and **Regular** for other Forrester spindle types (Pewter in base). Of course, they can be used however the customer wants. The Pyrography ones retail at \$49.95 and the Regular Pewter ones at \$44.95.

- 3. The *Domino* spindle:** This is a new spindle design. It is comprised of a single whorl on a fancy-turned shaft. A domino is places above the whorl and just below the fancy turnings on the shaft. Interestingly enough, I have discovered that there are several different styles of dominos. There are the traditional black ones with 6 dots per side. However there are also ones with 9 dots (double 9’s), and 12 dots per side (double 12’s). There are also coloured ones where the domino is fully coloured, or just the dots are coloured. Such variety in “Domino Land” – who knew? These are a bit of fun. These spindles retail for \$54.95.
